COLOUR-SORTING YOUR GLASS: BEST PRACTICE RECYCLING

Georgia green, sea green, and arctic blue bottles should be recycled with **GREEN** cullet.

Flint or clear bottles: If there is ANY doubt as to whether the bottle is tinted or not, it should be recycled with **GREEN** cullet.

Some bottles feature plastic sleeve labels. It can be very difficult to see the colour of the bottle underneath. Look at the base or inside the bottle's neck to confirm its colour.

Some beverage companies buy glass containers that are the same size and shape, but vary slightly in colour – these are called 'off-colour' bottles.

These 'off-colour' bottles should all be recycled with GREEN.

'Best practice' means if you are ever in any doubt if a bottle is clear, recycle it with GREEN.
